After leaving Valparaiso, Chile we headed west into the South Pacific. Weather was fine, seas were calm, and we got to visit three of the most distant and obscure islands in the world. First was Robinson Crusoe island, where a seaman marooned on the island for four years became the inspiration for the book. A couple more days at sea, then we spent two days touring the ruins on Easter Island, and, most obscure of all, we called at Pitcairn Island, home of the descendents of the famous Bounty mutineers.
