New Zealand has a population of 4 million, but only 600,000 of them live on the wild and beautiful South Island. Our first stop was the world-famous fjords at the southern tip—where unfortunately it was cold, foggy, and rainy, the first bad weather of the trip. Then it was onto Dunedin, a bustling university town, where we took a narrow-gauge railway into the mountainous outback.
